HOMILY ON THE FEAST OF ST KATERI

Lily of the Mohawks (1656 - April 17, 1680)

At the beginning The great philosopher, Jacques Maritain, had this to say: "Since the Church triumphant is one with the Church militant, and because the saints continue to care for things on earth and remain interested in them, it follows that they certainly have their ideas and their intentions relating to these things, to the life and behaviour of each of us, to the events of the world, and to the progression and expansion of the reign of God."

Homily The readings of today remind us that Christ's mission was not about gaining power or showing authority. It is about service: serving the poor, the marginalized, the needy, the little ones and it is about spreading the unconditional love of God to all God's creatures.

Through the example of his life, Jesus wanted his disciples to follow him by serving other and loving them unconditionally. He taught them that through their lives and service, the love of God touches every creature, every individual with no exception.

Kateri Tekakwitha took Christ's teaching into her heart, and during her painful and short life, she continued to serve her people and the church's mission and to love everyone, even those who opposed her decision. Her trust and faith in Christ made her one with Him and made her saint, the first saint of Indigenous people.

With the example of her life, Saint Kateri showed us that it is possible to be truly indigenous and truly Christian.

She showed us that even in pain and despair, it is possible to love and to trust. There has been sufferings and pains in the lives of indigenous people, and it still continues, but there is a growing faith and trust in the Lord amongst indigenous people. Saint Kateri is the embodiment of Catholic indigenous people today.

There is a long story between the church and the indigenous people. We have walked together for centuries. There has been ups and downs during our journey; there has been joy and laughter, and there has been hurts and wounds as well. There has been even moments or rupture, misunderstanding and mistrusts. There was a moment when everything became so dark and we walked in a desert. But in all of that darkness and dryness sprung a new life, a new hope, a new way of loving. From the darkness shines the light of a little star, out of the desert came a beautiful flower: the Lili of the Mohawk.

The canonization of St Kateri, of which we celebrate the 6th anniversary today, is a sign for the whole world, that the Church recognizes the value and richness of indigenous people, that their faith in Christ and their culture and traditions can co-exist, can be lived together, that being at the same time indigenous people and catholic is a reality, and especially, the Church believes that we can walk together again for the healing of our people.

Like the disciples of Christ, on this world mission Sunday, we are all sent into the world to serve the little ones and to spread God's unconditional love. As indigenous people, with the model and the prayers of St Kateri, you are sent to spread that Good News, sent to proclaim that God's love embraces everyone from every culture, every race; you are sent to announce that you are

a beautiful people created in the image of the Creator. That is what our Lord did: with his pain and suffering and his death on the cross, he never ceased to love us, and he endured all of that for his love for us. That is what St Kateri did: with the pain from the disease and scars in her body, and the mockery and the hatred from some people, she continued to love and to pray for them.

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Here what St Kateri tells us today: "Go and shine! do not let your pain and suffering overtake your strength; do not let them overshadow your beauty. Within your brokenness, you are still very beautiful, my people! Now, with your deep faith in the Lord and in the Creator, with the richness, the value and the beauty of your culture and traditions, arise and proclaim that the Creator loves all of us as who we are. I am with you, always."

As indigenous people and as the Church, with the prayers of St Kateri, let us continue to journey together for the healing and reconciliation of our people.

Father Cholonec wrote that Tekakwitha said: "I have deliberated enough. For a long time my decision on what I will do has been made. I have consecrated myself entirely to Jesus, son of Mary, I have chosen Him for husband and He alone will take me for wife". [15]

Pope Francis recalls World Mission Sunday

On the annual occurrence of World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis invites all people, both young and old, to participate in the mission of the Church to bring the Gospel to everyone.

Pope Francis recalled World Mission Sunday during his Angelus address, inviting everyone to participate in the Church's mission.

He said the theme for this year's occurrence – "Together with young people, let us bring the Gospel to all" – is the path forward for the Church.

"We are experiencing this reality, thanks be to God," the Pope said, "during these days of the Synod dedicated to them: by listening to them and involving them we discover many examples of young people who have found in Jesus the meaning and joy of life."

Pope Francis said they have often discovered Jesus "thanks to other young people who have already participated in the communion of his brothers and sisters, which is the Church."

The Pope prayed "that future generations may not lack the proclamation of the faith and the call to collaborate in the mission of the Church."

Message for World Mission Sunday - In his message for World Mission Sunday, released in May, Pope Francis reminds all that "we are not in this world by our own choice," and hence there is "an initiative that precedes us and makes us exist." Each one of us, he says, is called to reflect on the fact that 'I am a mission on this Earth," which is why we are here in this world.

In fact, the Pope says, "every man and woman is a mission." He says that "to be attracted and to be sent are two movements" of the heart that "hold out promise for our future and give direction to our lives."

Gift of self

In his message, the Pope urges young people not to be afraid of Christ and his Church, because, he says, "it is where "we find the treasure that fills life with joy."

Speaking from his own experience, he says that through faith he found the sure foundation of his dreams and the strength to realize them.

"For those who stand by Jesus," the Pope continues, "evil is an incentive to ever greater love," because "from the cross of Jesus we learn the divine logic of self-sacrifice as a proclamation of the Gospel for the life of the world.

The Pope thus invites young people to ask themselves, "What would Christ do if he were in my place?"

Transmitting the faith

All Christians by Baptism, the Pope recalls, have received the mission to bring the Gospel to everyone.

Young people too are part of that great stream of witnesses, in which elder persons with their wisdom and experience become a witness and encouragement to the young. This way, he says, the mission of the Church bridges the generations bringing about unity.

Infectious love

The heart of the Church's mission, the Pope continues, is the infectiousness of love, where joy and enthusiasm become the expression of a newfound meaning and fulfillment in life. The spread of the faith "by attraction", he says, calls for hearts that are open and expanded by love. This generates encounter, witness and proclamation even in "extreme peripheries" which are indifferent and hostile and to the ends of the earth in 'missio ad gentes'.

"No one is so poor as to be unable to give what they have, but first and foremost what they are," says Pope Francis.



CELEBRATION IN HONOR OF ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

"The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy."
(Ps.126)

This Sunday's Psalm prayer is so appropriate as we celebrate the sixth anniversary of the canonization of our very own Mohawk saint, Kateri Tekakwitha. For 332 years after her death on April 17, 1650, Kateri's friends of every tribe and nation honored her and prayed for miracles through her intercession. Here at St. Regis we fervently prayed:

O God, Who among the many marvels of Your grace in the New World did cause to blossom on the banks of the Mohawk and the St. Lawrence the pure and tender lily, Kateri Tekakwitha, grant we beseech You that this young lover of Jesus and of His cross may soon be counted among her saints by the Holy Mother Church and that our hearts may be enkindled with a stronger desire to imitate her innocence and faith.

We were filled with joy when centuries of prayers were answered. Many gathered in Rome on October 21, 2012 to witness Pope Benedict XVI proclaim: SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA, PRAY FOR US! May we pray daily to St. Kateri to help our families to grow in the faith and love that she manifested. May we imitate her love for Jesus at Holy Mass, bear our crosses with patience, care for our neighbor with generosity.

WELCOME ARCHBISHOP TERRENCE PRENDERGAST, S.J.

The St. Regis Mission Parish is honoured to have Archbishop Terrence T. Prendergast, S.J., with us to celebrate Holy Mass on the occasion of the sixth anniversary of the canonization of Saint Kateri Tekakwitha. Born in Montreal in 1944, Terrence Prendergast entered the Society of Jesus in 1961 and was ordained a priest in 1972. Educated at Fordham University, NY and St. Mary's University, Halifax, Father Prendergast taught at Loyola High School, Montreal, Atlantic School of Theology, Halifax, and served as Rector of Regis College, Toronto. Also, he was a Visiting Professor of Theology at the *Ecole Biblique* in Jerusalem.

In 1995, he was consecrated Bishop at St. Michael's Cathedral, Toronto, serving as Auxiliary Bishop of Toronto until appointed Archbishop of Halifax in 1998. In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI assigned Archbishop Prendergast to the See of Ottawa. Recently the Diocese of Alexandria/Cornwall was also placed under his administration.

Archbishop Prendergast is president of the National Evangelization Teams Canada and chair of the Catholic Near East Welfare Association. We are very grateful that he has come to celebrate our Mass today.
