Story of Kateri Tekakwitha

The "Lily of the Mohawks" was born in 1656 at Ossernenon, near Awiesville. New York, where Saint Isaac Jogues and Companions were martyred, 1642-46. Her mother and father died when she was a child of four. "Nateri" is Catherine in English and Tekakwitha means "putting things in order."

Charity, flowing from an intense love of God was the main virtue dominating Kateri's life. She was baptized at 20, on Easter, April 18, 1676, by a French Jesuit Missionary

In spite of many obstacles, including partial blindness, scarring-from smallpox, persecution when converted and many evits, she stayed observed and Our Lady, blossoming as a lily.

She escaped to the Christian village of Caughnawaga, Canada, where she lived in peace and joy with Indians of all clans. The formerly-savage tribes became lambs of God through acceptance of the Gospel of Christ.

Kateri died at 24, on April 17, 1680. On January 3, 1943 Pope Pius XII, proclaimed Kateri. Venerable a person of heroic virtue. She is a model of peace; teaching all that man must understand and love one another since they have but one Father, the Creator of all.
