THE TEKAKWITHA CONFERENCE

For the fiftieth time, the Tekakwitha Conference convened, this year from August 2 to 6 at Fargo, N.D., where it had first met in 1939. The theme: "Walking the Sacred Circle With Jesus Christ." About 3,000 Indians attended the Conference. Numerous workshops led by specialists—many of them Native North Americans-were appreciated by the participants. On Saturday, August 5, Bishop James Sullivan of Fargo ordained a Benedictine Indian a deacon with the expectation he would be elevated to the priesthood next May. His Eminence, Francis Cardinal Arinze, delegated to the Conference by the Vatican, gave the keynote address: "An Authentic Response to the Call of Christ in His Church." The Kateri quarterly intends to present this significant talk to its readers in one of its future issues.

THOMAS B. CONSTANTINO

R.I.P.



T HE GOOD LORD called to Himself on Monday afternoon, September 25, a dear friend of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha and of the Native North American Indians, Mr. Thomas B. Constantino. After Jesus, Mary and Joseph, Padre Pio and Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha were his two great devotions.

As early as 1965, Tom and I became acquainted. I saw his love for the Lily of the Mohawks grow and expand. Already in the summer of 1965, he visited Kahnawake with Fr. William Schlaerth, former Vice-Postulator of Kateri for the United States.

Tom was the inventor of the litterbag and founder of the Noteworthy Company of Amsterdam, N.Y. which became a great success in the quarter of a century he directed its destiny. He was widely known for his countless benefactions and efforts to promote the beatification and canonization of Kateri Tekakwitha. Only the directors of the Shrines of Our Lady of Martyrs at Auriesville and of Kateri Tekakwitha at Fonda, N. Y. along with the pastors of the surrounding parishes could tell what he did to help them in their work. He also founded scholarships for Indian students in different colleges.

Here are a few samplings of Tom's widespread interests. At the International Eucharistic Congress held in Philadelphia from July 30 to August 7, 1976, he did a tremendous job preparing and financing two stands—one dedicated to the Jesuit Martyrs and the other to Kateri Tekakwitha. His Eminence Cardinal Wojtyla, the future Pope John Paul II was no doubt impressed when he visited the Tekakwitha booth and was shown around by a Polish guide.

In the fall of 1981, Tom wrote to President Reagan, sending him the stamp of the Beata issued by the Canadian government. "We are very fortunate here in the Mohawk Valley," wrote the President of Noteworthy to the President of the United States, "to have been inspired by the holy Mohawk Maiden, who here spent most of her life." President Reagan was pleased with Tom Constantino's letter and said so; he also congratulated him on the environmental park dedicated to Blessed Kateri he was then planning.

On May 13, 1983, feast of Our Lady of Fatima, a bronze statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary was unveiled in the Vatican Gardens. It was the second anniversary of the attempt on the Holy Father's life in 1981. As a visible expression of his gratitude, His Holiness desired a statue for the Vatican Gardens. The model chosen was the work of Frederick Shrady, a noted American sculptor. The statue of Our Lady of Fatima was commissioned by Cardinal Casaroli, Vatican Secretary of State, acting in the Holy Father's name, and Tom Constantino underwrote it.

At the Auriesville Shrine, Blessed Kateri's birthplace, a replica of this statue was unveiled and blessed by His Excellency Bishop Howard J. Hubbard of Albany on May 29. Once again Tom took care of the cost.

On February 12, 1984, an artistic reproduction of the Virgin of Guadalupe, Empress of the Americas, was unveiled in the sanctuary of the St. Regis church at the St. Regis-Akwesasne reservation. Tom Constantino, longtime friend of Kateri and the Mohawk people, donated the painting to the Mission. Among other kindnesses to St. Regis, he also completely renovated one of the rooms of the rectory he didn't find to his liking.

On October 27, at the invitation of Pope John Paul II, representatives of the world religions gathered in Assisi, Italy to pray and fast for world peace. At the request of Fr. Gilbert Hemauer, OFM Cap., Tom Constantino financed the presence of Mr. Burton Pretty On Top, who ably represented the traditionalist American Indians in praying for world peace.

Then for the episcopal ordinations of the Very Reverend Fathers Donald E. Pelotte, first Amerindian Bishop, Gallup, N. M. and of Charles J. Chaput, OFM Cap., second Native American Bishop, Rapid Clty, S. D. in 1986 and 1988 respectively, Tom supplied Fr. Tom Egan and myself with tickets for these events as well as for other destinations where Blessed Kateri's interests were at stake.

About thirty years ago, the Kateri quarterly was in the red. The late Joseph O'Brien of Cleveland, Ohio, rescued me and kept me afloat for many years. Last October, once again, I had financial difficulties. Like Queen Victoria, my Provincial told me "I am not amused!" This time it was Tom who came to my help. He organized a drive which saved me from going under and, I believe, "amused" my Provincial.

That's one of the many reasons why I attended my benefactor's and friend's funeral. Bishop Howard Hubbard of Albany celebrated the funeral Mass with some 20 priests concelebrating and about 800 friends and acquaintances in attendance in beautiful St. Mary's Church, Amsterdam. My prayers and heartfelt condolences to Carol, and to their two beautiful children, Anthony and Nicholas.

The inspiration seeks to place this new association under the protection and help of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. The Secretariate of State has transmitted to this Dicastery, for its competence, the letter you addressed to the Holy Father requesting authorization to found a new North American (Canada and the U.S.A.) Mission Society for priests.

In this regard, I wish, first of all, to express to you the appreciation of this Congregation for your missionary work and for the interest you are continuing to take in the diffusion of the Gospel Message.

With regard to the foundation of a new Society for the Missions, it would be advisable for you to present your project to the Bishop of the diocese where you intend realizing it, so as to commence what subsequently could become an Association with an exclusively missionary finality "ad Gentes".

Only after some years, when the Association will have become consolidated and have about 20 members, who have been duly formed and bound to the same by well defined ties, can one think of asking the Holy See, through the diocesan Ordinary, to elevate the said Pious Union to a Society of Apostolic Life with an exclusively missionary




