It is evident that the missionaries who knew Kateri did not want to make a "French" Christian out of her. She in reality remained a "Native". It's the gift of God to be able to incarnate oneself in every race, all cultures, without disturbing them.

The missionaries who disembarked on the shores of New France, like in Florida or Santo Domingo, first of all planted the cross, to show clearly that they were evangelizers, that they came to announce the Good News with the hope of forming new children of God. The Relations of the Jesuits tell us about missionaries who made an effort to learn the language of the "First Nations"; they even succeeded in composing grammars and dictionaries in Mohawk, Huron and others. This was of primary importance to make known the God of the Bible, announce the Good News, to help the First Nations to fall in love with the person of Christ.

Kateri, at a very early age, became passionately fond of the Lord, "a God who loved us so much that He became a human being to save them all." Kateri prayed with the soul of an Indian. She always nurtured thanksgiving in her heart and on her lips, she practiced this spirit of purification so dear to the Iroquois; she respected the wills of her ancients, as long as they did not come into conflict with her God.

Today, fortunately, in all mission lands, be it in Asia, in Africa or in South America, a great effort is exerted to understand the cultures of the evangelized, which is not easy to do because of the cross cultures. In Canada and in the United States, missionaries who live with the Indians, look back to the roots and encourage the Natives to find again their indentity. It is not enough for the Natives to say very simply: Let us be traditional! Still they have to rediscover their authentic traditions which speak to their soul and which are but a new facet of the richness of God.

May the Iroquois Virgin, inspire those who try to discover their true identity. Then we can say that Christ is Indian, or Chinese or African...

Movie shows respect, reality

"Thunderheart" can make you laugh and make you cry. It can make you hope and may help you understand.

Thunderheart uses some Hollywood pap to entertain, like shootouts, killings and the suspense of the unknown. But it doesn't resort to graphic violence and sex or mindless slapstick humor to hold an audience

Nor does it employ the mediocre device of demarcating the good guys from the bad by the style of clothes they wear, cars they drive or the titles or badges they bear.

Like The Mission, Thunderheart shows the dark side of colonialism. Like Dances With Wolves, it shows the First Peoples respect and touches on the reality that the consequences of contact with the white world have not been a rose garden for them.

In addition, Thunderheart explores native mysticism and spirituality, and teaches some native mystic or mythical concepts.

Thunderheart lets its audience come to like its main character and grow with the character. It also provides a metaphor for the way Uncle Sam treats the peoples of Central and South America and the consequences of that treatment. For that reason, it probably won't win the big awards.

North Ontario Kateri conference

Some of the steps one takes today will never again be taken in exactly the same way.

This appeared to be the belief of several hundred people who recently chose to venture on a journey towards "Rediscovering the Sacred Tree". Close to 300 people from all across Canada assembled in Thunder Bay to participate in an Ontario Native Kateri Conference at Lakehead University from Wednesday to Saturday of last wek.

The purpose of the Kateri Conference was to bring personal healing for participants and to help bridge the cultural gap between Natives and Non-Natives and between Christians and Native spiritual traditionalists. According to the event's coordinators, the conference theme of Rediscovering the Sacred Tree was meant to indicate healing.

Some of the participants had been wounded by addiction, family violence, sexual abuse, and residential school oppression. During the various sessions, the people chose to face their pain and talk about it. Most of them agreed that they no longer wanted to let the symptoms of their pain control their lives.

Most also agreed that healing meant moving in the direction of acquiring and accepting a strong sense of self - of spiritual wholeness, of dignity and pride in who one is. And they viewed healing as a journey towards wellness, to be taken one step at a time, one day at a time.

Along with Christian songs and prayers, some of the common traditional Native ways of healing were offered to the conference participants. They could partake. in a Sacred Circle, a Sweat Lodge, a Pow-Wow, and a Sunrise Service.

The Sacred Heart Drum

The Sacred Heart drum focuses on Jesus Christ and, at the same time, respects Native culture by using a traditional native instrument, the drum. It is a universal drum, a drum of peace and love, and a drum of unity and goodwill. It represents Christ who came to earth as a little child his little heart beating with love for us. He is Christ, our God, whose love fills the whole of creation.

There are so many divisions in today's world. Sometimes. even good people are divided because of this or that. The drum is a sign of reconciliation between all races. The circle of the drum represents God's unending love for us: a love that brings us together, from the ends of the earth, into the circle of community, the Church. through the receiving of the Eucharist: the body and blood of



Jesus Christ Himself. The leather of the drum represents something sacrificed; the red color, His blood shed for us. The skin, pierced and stretched out on the wooden frame of the drum symbolizes Christ stretched out on the cross. The empty drum speaks of Jesus emptying himself and giving His all for us. The leather is warmed to make a good sound, so must our love be warm and from the heart to ring true. Finally the drum must be struck to make a good sound. This is where we come in. We are all called to beat the drum of God's love in our lives. Christ depends on us to build his church through our love.

The power of the Indian Rosary of Kateri

I'm a French woman from Normandy,. Kateri changed my life radically, one night in June 1980. I had never heard before of this big sister in heaven.

Following her footseteps as a pilgrim in 1981, in Canada and in the U.S., I discovered at the Kateri Center in Auriesville N.Y.' her little rosary of 24 beads. The notice with it was written in English, so on my return to France I had to ask a friend to help me translate it.

Charmed by the naivete and beauty of the rosary, the work of an Amerindian artist, I adopted it to ask God to make Kateri a saint in our Church and that she may "put order" in my life once more.

As much as I could, I went to recite this little rosary in a small grove close to my house called "Frileuse" (co fearing), thinking about Kateri, praying her and looking for the presence of the Great Spirit in the song of a bird, of a brook. I will tell you how the Lord and Kateri twice blessed the recitation of the Rosary.

I had a wonderful German shepherd and I had to part with it. For three weeks, I didn't go and recite my rosary at the "Frileuse", as I feared going there alone, but I missed this very much. One day I decided to overcome my fear and go back there. But going through the grove I missed "Thyna" and I complained to Kateri telling her: Today, as you see, I don't have the joy of seeing squirrels running in front of my darling dog (that she would chase away without any malice and that she could not retain when they climbed up a tree. She then resigned herself to moan at the foot of the tree...) And I continued my prayer of the rosary a few moments later, sitting by an oak tree, praying this to Kateri: "Kateri, allow me to meet a small squirrel to console me in my sadness."

The idea also of seeing one on the closest branch drove me to add: "I would like to contemplate one on this oak branch, the closest to me, and I went on with my prayer. All of a sudden, I heard a furtive sound, turned around and I saw passing just a few meters away a small squirrel, which ran in the opposite direction... Nevertheless I redoubled my prayer, repeating my wish.

Once more a light sound attracted my attention. Here again

that small messenger of Kateri came back my way. I prayed and my heart beat was so fast... The more I prayed, the closser he came to me jumping from branch to branch, till he came without hesitation to the very branch I had indicated to Kateri...

I was dazzled by the grace and beauty of this wild creature of God who started to utter small cries that I imitated. Surprised he discovered me, hesitated, approached again. Then a real dialogue began. I spoke to him in "his language" and he answered back to me.... After a few hesitations, he went back on his way... leaving me overjoyed by this unforgettable instant.

The following days I returned to the grove with my photocamera but the little squirrel never came back!...

In this manner my fear was won and I took the habit of returning to pray in the woods.

Many years after, I still wandered along this small path reciting my little rosary which has taught me this attention to the presence of God in Creation. But on that day I went through such a great suffering of solitude that I believed that the Lord and Kateri had forgotten me altogether and I cried out to them: "But why this solitude?" This solitude that I felt - the Lord willed it to make me penetrate further in this reality of His presence in Creation.

To instruct me, the "poet Jesus" joined in with me and lifted for a few moments the veil which covered my eyes so I could see the splendor of creation.

I know today that the whole creation, by the splendor of its beauty continually renders thanks to its Creator and urges us to enter in this liturgycal and cosmic concert to his greater glory.




