In 1677, Joseph Rontagarha, then twenty-five years of age, came to live at the Mission of St. Francis Xavier. He had already been to France and had showed himself a fairly good Christian after his return. Following a hunting expedition with Tiouasteskon, a Mohawk brave, member of the Holy Family Association, he became a devout church-goer. The conversations with his friend led him to a personal love of Christ. He often collected the children of the neighborhood in his longhouse and taught them the Creed and other prayers which were sung at church, much to the satisfaction of the Blackrobes.

THE QUEBEC GARDEN The Legend of Mother Earth

In the beginning, the Earth did not exist. The world was an island floating above the sky in the ocean of the first times. One day a young woman of the Huron-Wendat nation, named Aataensic, went out looking for medicinal plant.

She tripped over a tree root, and she and the tree both fell through a hole in the sky. The animals rushed to save her from drowning. Entranced by her beauty, the Great Geese took flight and broke her fall in mid-air, setting her down on the shell of the turtle, since they had to find somewhere comfortable for her to live.

The animals held a council and decided to create a great land for her. With much difficulty, they managed to collect a bit of the mud from the roots of the tree that had fallen with her from the sky.

The Great Turtle offered to carry this earth on its back, so the other animals began spreading the mud over its shell. It grew into a huge island, then a continent, and finally the Earth we know.

And that, according to the Huron-Wendat, one of the First Nations of Quebec, is how the Earth was created.

Blessed is Kateri: A woman of the Beatitudes



A Native American woman lived and died on the North American continent a hundred years before America was born. An illiterate Mohawk, Kateri Tekakwitha couldn't read the New Testament, but it's clear that the Jesuits who welcomed her into the faith, taught her the Gospel well. She embraced all that she learned. One of her lessons would have been the Beatitudes (Matt.5:1-12). which are a crystallization of the teachings of Jesus. For two thousand years, this radical message of Jesus has had the power to console as well as to challenge us. In her life of selfless devotion to God and others. Blessed Kateri received the consolation and more then met the demands that they made of her. The life of the Lily of the Mohawks could be described as the "living Beatitudes". Let's see how Kateri responded to each of the Beatitudes, and then "hold up a mirror to ourselves" and see how we might respond with more openness and love.

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Why would Jesus bless "poverty?" Is not "richness in spirit" what God is looking for? In a word, "yes," but God can only "fill hands that are empty." When we admit that we're nothing without God, which is the essence of humility, then we can receive the abundant grace of God.


Such was the humility of Kateri. She understood that everything good in her came from God. She could not claim her virtues as her own. Thus, she could receive the rich gifts of the Holy Spirit who alone brings the Kingdom of Heaven to the human heart.

Do I see myself as "rich in spirit? " Am I self-satisfied and complacent?

Do I understand in my heart, that God is the true source of any good that is in me? Do I realize that I am truly nothing without him? Do I come before Him with "empty hands?" so that I might receive the gift of the Holy Spirit?

Kateri in VIETNAM



"It was in 1973, near the end. Our team was in Cambodia on a reconnaissance mission. We weren't supposed to be there according to the rules, but it was necessary in a war that had no rules.

Intelligence had reported a buildup of North Vietnamese Regulars that had come down the Ho Chi Minh Trail, and our mission was to observe them and report back.

Everything was going fine until we interdicted a patrol. Confrontation was unavoidable, and although we came through without a scratch, the whole of the enemy camp was alerted due to our close proximity at the time.

They were on us in no time. There must have been a battalion of them. The first to get it was the operations sergeant. Two more than fell and then the captain.

We fought our way out with a modified pincher offensive. Half of us made it, half were dead. We couldn't carry them out. The radio was destroyed, as well as our operator, so we were completely on our own. No way to call in for a lift out.

They hounded us all night. They must have had our scent, so to speak. And of course, there were so many, that all they had to do was to spread out, which they did. They caught up with us again before daybreak. Luckily it was a small patrol, I thought. But they had a .50 caliber machine gun, one of ours captured from a previous encounter. How they moved with it so fast I'll never

know. When they opened up with that thing, all hell broke loose. At the end of the fight, only two of us were left.

For a while, a very short while, I thought the two of us would make it out. Of all the fellows on the team, I was closest to him. I really felt bad about losing everyone else, but the fact that my best buddy of my whole life was with me made me feel

good. My friend got hit in the legs. It was a long shot but his legs were nearly separated from the rest of him. The main artery in his right leg had a hole in it and he was going fast, but not fast enough.

I dropped all my gear except the Swedish K and my ammo belt and canteen, and took off in a dead run. In a matter of seconds the sky cracked open. Whatever scent they had of me was diffused by the downpour. It was like heaven was crying with me, and I tasted the salt.

With numbness through my body, I just kept up the pace for what seemed like an eternity.

I sat down on a fallen trunk. There were fifty miles of jungle between me and safety, and I had no idea where I was. That's when I saw her. Just a bit ahead of me, an Indian maiden, with a glow about her. Now I would call her a Native American princess, but back then I just recognized that she was of one of the North American tribes.

She signaled for me to come, which I did. She moved through the jungle with such grace and purpose as I have never seen before or since. And I felt such a sense of peace and security in her presence that I found a renewed strength to keep on going. She always stayed ahead of me, but not too far. All I could do was to follow. My mind was inquisitive and I felt like a child. And yet I felt a strength in me of ten men.

She zigzagged here and there, but always went forward. My legs should have been getting heavy, but I felt like I was walking on water. I followed her all day. Whenever I said something, she just turned and smiled.

I was getting tired by nightfall, and my vision was getting fuzzy. But the Angel in Deerskin touched me, somehow, and I received new strength. My legs felt like water but now I did not stop. I just had to catch up with that beautiful maiden with a glow about her.

The next thing I knew I caught sight of the compound. When I got in and was questioned, I asked, "Since when are we using WACs in Indian clothes as guides?" The officer called in the sergeant to show me a bunk I could sleep in, as I surely needed it.

I never forgot her face, or her beautiful, graceful body for that matter. It wasn't until I saw her picture on the leaflet for the Catholic Charities appeal that I found out who she was. There were some differences, but that was her. I followed her through 50 miles of jungle.

She has been leading me back ever since. Someday I hope to meet her again, face to face. Her name was Kateri Tekakwitha."

FRENCH COMPUTER

Here, he is besides his new statue carved by a known artist in British Columbia.




