## I abandon myself...

Abandonment: what a nice and long word, if well articulated, once said, you seem to fall in the arms of a savior. It can also mean: to desist oneself, to renounce, to get rid altogether. The abandon we want to speak about is the acceptation of one's lot, inevitable for different reasons: accident, sickness, and old age.

It is mostly when your hair turns white that you must exercise this abandonment. Abandonment not only to the medical doctor, to the specialist, to the sophisticated medicaments, but abandon one self to our heavenly Father: "Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven".

"We must abandon ourselves without reserve, repeating in our heart: "I relinquish all things for your divine will...".

The Word of God is again teaching us this attitude. The holy man Job in all his trials never stop saying: "Bless be thy holy Name!" He had lost all his belongings, his sons, his spouse, his herds, his own health, but it was always the same refrain of the abandonment to the will of God.

On Christmas Eve or during our visit to the crib, we should meditate and make ours the sentiments of Joseph and Mary. Mary, living in Galilee, is pregnant and must go to Judea to register and at the same time to give birth. That means a long trip on a donkey's back. Arriving in Bethlehem, nobody helps them find a lodging, not even the hotelkeeper. They abandon themselves to bring the Savior of the world in a poor stable.





## Pontiff of the End Times

Prophetic revelations, unfulfilled prophecies, the third secret of Fatima and the death of Pope John Paul II have set the stage for the election of an amazingly wise, gentle and humble German theologian whom I have come to respect over the course of 14 years.



"Papa-Razi," so we amusingly call him in Rome, is the latest edition to the long succession of Roman Pontiffs to continue the work of Global re-evangelization.

He pronounced his reason for accepting the role of Pontiff no less than a week after his election: to heal divisions created within the Church (especially among the Orthodox and Catholics), to continue what John Paul II started, and to preach the truth in charity.

I met with Josef Cardinal Ratzinger on numerous occasions in Rome while he was yet Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith. In our encounters, I spoke to him of the modern prophetic messages of modern mystics, in which he expressed a surprisingly great

interest. On another occasion, while at dinner with him at the Brigidine Sisters Home in Rome, the theme of our conversation was again prophecy and mysticism.

The nominal change from His Eminence to His Holiness doesn't change the theological views of the once Prefect of the Congregation for the Doctrine of Faith. I can truly say that Pope Benedict XVI is more abreast in the field of prophecy and prophetic revelations than any other Pontiff of modern times. It was he that theologically reviewed materials, new Marian communities within the church founded upon prophetic revelations. Most reassuringly it's a fact that in 1994 he released from the Vatican to the Archdiocese of rani the 36 volumes of Luisa - Piccarreta. I have come to know Pope Benedict XVI as an unpretentious man of high theological erudition, and a great alacrity and openness to the Holy Spirit.

I am convinced that he is and will be regarded as one of the greatest Catholic theologians of modern times. Certainly, there are papal bashers who will use his German heritage as leverage to accuse him of freemasonic conspiracy and Vatican espionage, and yet my personal experiences reveal him as a man of profound integrity who places the gospel above his own life and interests.

### - PONTIFF OF THE END TIMES -

I am well aware of the Freemason infiltration within Catholic circles, of the globe movement toward a one world government of the quest for an elitist society founded? On the Darwinian "survival of the fittest" and deliberate polarization of the rich and poor. Despite all this, if ever there is someone to offset the diabolic and communist movements in our society, that someone is Pope Benedict XVI.

On another note, Pope Benedict has a very human side that he brings to the papacy. Shortly after the papal election, his move into the papal quarters met with an unexpected problem: The Vatican administrative services initially refused him the possibility of transferring his two live in mates to the new papal residence. By the time the Italian media made it front page news, Vatican security specialists conceded to the new papal elect's request that he continue to share his living quarters with his two life time papal cats! Not only is the pontiff an animal sympathizer, he is a man of immediate action.

Unlike those who throw out decisions like manhole covers, Pope Benedict's approach to decision making is deliberated for days in consultation with those he has come to trust from his term in the office of Prefect for the Doctrine of Faith, and only then is it brought to prayer and discernment before the Blessed Sacrament. His former office blessed him with a knowledge few possess, namely, a keen sense of pressing modern issues in and outside of the church. Moreover, on May 13, 2005, less than one month after his papal election, Pope Benedict made his first decision in the beatification process.

Normally five years pass before the beatification process begins for a person after his or her death but due to the popularity of John Paul II, devotees chanted "Santo subito!" meaning "Saint now!".

During the late Pontiff's funeral, Benedict XVI waived the custom and officially styled the late Pope with the title given to all those being scrutinized in the beatification process, Servant of God. Upon confirmation of the scrutiny of the late Pontiff's life, which if found morally clean and manifest heroic virtues, a degree of heroicity will be proclaimed and John Paul II will be declared Venerable, the first step on the road to beatification. Upon the confirmation of miracles attributed to the honoree, John Paul II would then be declared Blessed, and only then may he be officially celebrated in Mass.

Let us pray every day for Pope Benedict XVI and offer up for him a rosary in the Divine Will. We truly need him.

# Remembering Rev. John J. Paret, s.j.

As many of you may already know our Vice-Postulator, Father John J. Paret, S.J., passed on to his reward August 29, 2006. We are told by those who were with him at the time that Father Paret was having breakfast at the Murray Weigel Community in the Bronx, New York. He turned his head slightly, smiled, and left this world with whoever seemed to call him.

Father Paret was a gentle man. He lived his life with gentle gusto. His wisdom, kindness, dedication and brilliant mind will be missed. He greeted everyone with a warm smile that said more than words.

You knew this man was eager and capable of handling your problem, or was ready to just sit and chat. He also loved to share funny stories and jokes, and his energy was boundless.

Born on April 12, 1919 in Flushing, Queens, New York, he was the son of the late John Julian and Sarah Elizabeth McGrath Paret.

Father Paret entered the Society of Jesus on August 14, 1940 and was ordained on June 17, 1951.


In his early years as a priest, Father Paret served at McQuaid High School in Rochester, New York. He had mentioned he remembered that time as one of the happiest in his life.

In fact, many people said "Jake" was always a teacher, as well as a fine pastor and shepherd of souls.

Before coming to Auriesville, Father Paret served in Puerto Rico and then in the New York Metropolitan area for twenty-five years. His services in those places included. Nativity Parish on the Lower East Side of Manhattan, also the Parish of St. Ignatius in the Crown Heights section of Brooklyn where almost all of the parishioners were Central American Immigrants.

Father Paret is interred at the Jesuit Cemetery, Auriesville, New York.

## A New Vice-Postulator



## The Blessed Kateri Tékakwitha - 1656-1680

(Conclusion)

#### **Her Vow of Virginity**

With her intimate friend Marie Thérèse Tegaiaguenta and a Huron named Marie Skarichions, Kateri had thought of founding a monastery for Indian nuns on Heron Island in the St. Lawrence River. Father Fremin objected that she had very little experience in Christian living. If she could not become a nun, perhaps she could dedicate her life to Christ as a lay person. Father Cholenec, her spiritual guide gives us his reaction: "...The thing was so unusual, however, and appeared so incompatible with the life of the



Indians, that I thought it best not to precipitate matters, so as to give her plenty of time to weigh a matter of such consequence. I tried her therefore, for some time, and after I had noted the great progress she made in every kind of virtue, and above all, with what profusion God communed with His Servant, It seemed to me that Kateri's design could come from no other source than from Him. Thereupon, I at last gave her permission to carry it out...

"It was the Feast of the Annunciation March 25, 1679, at eight o'clock in the morning when, a moment after Jesus Christ gave Himself to her in Communion, Kateri Tekakwitha wholly gave herself to Him, and renouncing marriage forever, promised Him perpetual virginity. With a heart aglow with love she implored Him to be her only spouse, and to accept her as His bride She prayed Our Lady, for whom she had a tender devotion, to present her to her Divine Son. Then, wishing to make a double consecration in one single act, she offered herself entirely to Mary at the same time that she dedicated herself to Jesus Christ, earnestly begging her to be her mother and to accept her as her daughter".

#### **Her Last Year**

The twelve last months of her life were for Kateri filled with suffering. Her headaches, perhaps the result of the smallpox she had contracted as a child, increased. During her last summer she suffered from a serious illness from which she never fully recovered it was followed by a slow fever, painful stomachaches, and frequent vomiting.

In February or March 1680, with the best of intentions, she acted rashly. She had heard about St. Aloyisius Gonzaga's penances, and in spite of her bad health,

asked herself why she could not do as much. Then, St. Benedict, founder of the Benedictines, whose rule recommends moderation, had mortified himself by rolling in thorns. So she strewed her mat with big, pointed thorns, and slept on them for three nights in a row. Her friend Marie Thérèse Tegaiaguenta saw that she looked wan and drawn, and after questioning her, told her that if she did this without her confessor's permission she was offending God. When Father Cholenec learned what Kateri had done, he blamed her and obliged her to throw the thorns into the fire. She instantly obeyed, but never recovered her strength.

On Tuesday of Holy Week, the missionary judged that it was time to give her the Holy Viaticum and offered to administer the Sacrament of Extreme Unction at the same time. She replied that there was no hurry and the priest delayed administering her until the next day.

Most of Kateri's friend had come back from the winter hunt. That night two members of the Holy Family Association, Marie the Penitent and Maguerite Gagouithon, kept watch at her bedside. The latter had practiced penance to obtain a beautiful death for Kateri who told her what she had done in her behalf, and encouraged her always to live as a fervent Christian. On Wednesday morning, the dying woman received Extreme Unction. Her friends and companions wanted to be present at the end. As it was Holy Week, they had to provide enough firewood for the last days of Lent, during which they did not intend to work. Marie Thérèse Tegaiaguenta mentioned the problem to the missionary, who in turn spoke about it to Kateri: They were advised to see to their provisions for the last days of Holy week and to have no fear of not returning to the long house in time. At three o'clock in the afternoon, on April 17, 1680, her friends gathered together around Kateri's mat. There was no death struggle. She went to her beloved Lord smiling peacefully. She was not quite twenty-four years old.

A few minutes later, her pock-pitted face was radiant with light. Her people were convinced that a ray of the glory that was hers was reflected on her features.

In 1941, Pope Pius XII officially proclaimed that Kateri Tekakwitha had practiced all Christian virtues to a heroic degree, thereby granting the title of Venerable to the Lily of the Mohawks. On June 22, 1980 Pope John Paul II beatified her.
