The Story of
BLESSED KATERI TEKAKWITHA
by Skanaieah

The National Shrine of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha is just outside Fonda, N.Y. On a hill in back of the shrine there is an excavated Indian Village that was once Gandaouague (Caughnawaga). Metal stakes replace the double wall of wooden posts that once fortified the village while different colored stakes mark the outline of each of the twelve longhouses that were inside. Tekakwitha lived in this village for ten or eleven years of her life. Some of her duties were to fetch water for the people in her longhouse, she carried wood for the fires, grounded the corn that was used to make soup and bread, and once the food was prepared, she served it. When there was nothing else to do, Tekakwitha, like the other girls, would pass the time decorating herself by wearing beads and rings and she also wore large, beautiful belts.

Our forefather, Deganawida with the help of Hiawatha formed a government that united the Mohawks, Oneidas, Onondagas, Cayugas and Senecas. These united tribes called themselves Rotinonsooni (They Built A House) because they stretched across New York State forming a symbolic longhouse. The Aseroni, or Ax Makers (French) called our united people Iroquois. The Rotinonsooni, Iroquois, were almost always at war with the Ax Makers. In 1666 a campaign led by N. De Tracy, consisting of French and Indians, came and burnt three of the Mohawk villages. In 1667 Rotinonsooni, Iroquois, were forced to make peace with the French. Tekakwitha made peace belts and decorated them with glass beads. When the peace negotiations took place with the Aseroni, one of her belts may even have been used. As a sign of good will, the Iroquois accepted three Blackrobes (Jesuit Priests) to preach among their people. The day the Blackrobes arrived there was a celebration taken place in the main Mohawk village, (Tionnontoguen). The first time Tekakwitha saw Blackrobes was when Fathers Fremin, Bruyas, and Pierron were housed in her village, Gandaouague and in her Uncle's house.

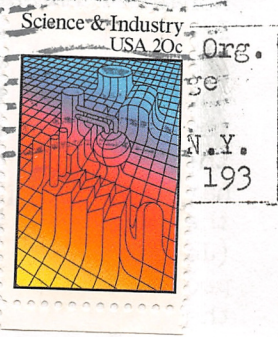
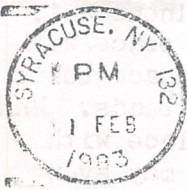

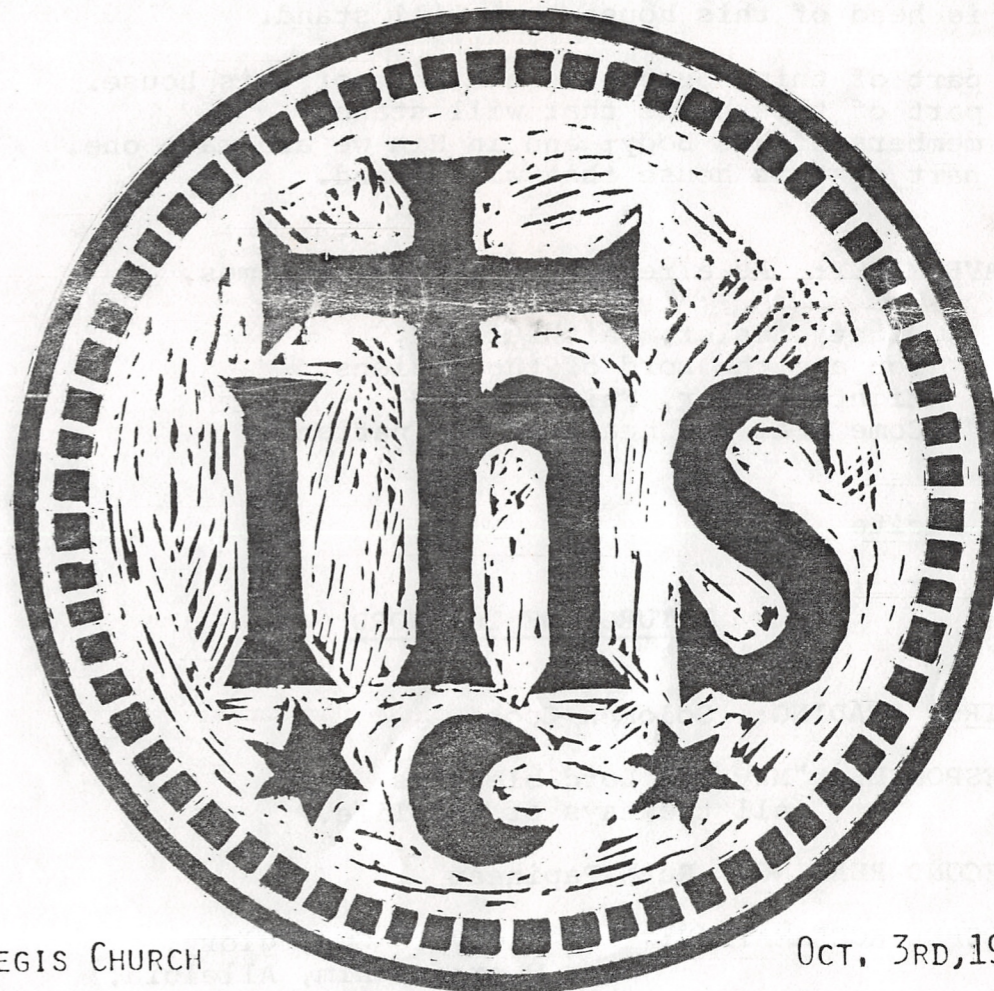

Indian Music Ministry Formed

The Kateri Prayer and Music Ministry, with members from the "District of Algoma to the District of Sudbury" traveled to the St. Regis Mohawk Reservation to present a prayer, witnessing, singing and healing service. The evening's service was presented at Kateri Hall with the group guests of the St. Regis Catholic Parish, St. Regis, Que.

The group, comprised of individuals of Ojibway ancestry, formed "to

reach Native Peoples ... to go to them for Jesus with a message of the Gospel and goodness of God," group member, Phyllis Sayers said.

"There was no Catholic Church in our village," she said, and so a chapel was created in the basement of their home. This group, singing and witnessing to their faith, formed first as the "Indian Prayer" group. Betsy Sayers said that the name was changed to the Kateri Prayer and Music Ministry following their trip to Rome

for the beatification of Kateri, known to Christian Mohawks as the Lily of the Mohawks.

The trip to the St. Regis Mohawk Reservation was looked at with significance, Betsy Sayers said, because of the Reservation's ties with the Kateri Tekakwitha. The group has grown since the beatification, Betsy Sayers said.

Betsy Sayers stated that we are "inspired to take something to the Native Peoples "

(CHRISTMAS EVE and Christmas Day, I was privileged to spend at the Iroquois Mission of St. Regis. Before I returned to Montreal, Fr. Thomas F. Egan, S.J., your new pastor, invited me to celebrate my Golden Jubilee as a Jesuit with you on Sunday, January 23. I gladly agreed as I had at Kahnawake and for the same reason: it would truly be a festival in honor of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha.

On Saturday afternoon, January 22, with Fr. Gérard Lavigne, S.J., Pastor Emeritus of St. Regis, at 1 P.M. I took the train at the Central Station in Montreal for Cornwall, Ont., where Bro. Bertrand Girard was awaiting us. One must cross the Roosevelt Bridge and pass through New York State to enter Canada and reach the Mission church. In Hogansburg, N.Y., we stopped at the parish hall, where a preparatory meeting was being held for the May Eastern Regional Tekakwitha Conference.

Participating were Fr. Egan and Fr. Robert L. Fleig, S.J., who welcomed us; Sr. Kateri Mitchell, S.S.A., Chairperson, Sr. Kathleen Navarra, S.S.J., Sr. Mary Wilfred Tremblay, S.S.A., the Mrs. Elaine Ransom, Ruth Papineau, Josephine Angus, Mary Garrow, and Mr. Alex Mitchell of St. Regis; Fr. Léon Lajoie, S.J., Pastor at St. Francis Xavier, and Sr. Roseline Gagnéux from Kahnawake; Mr. and Mrs. Art Bova from Syracuse, and Mrs. Sarah Monroe Hassenplug from Liverpool, N.Y.

After dinner at the historic rectory, prepared and served by Brother Girard, at 7 P.M., I concelebrated with Fr. Lavigne at ~~a~~ *the anticipated* sung-Mass, with Fr. Fleig as main celebrant and homilist. Before the final blessing, I briefly spoke on Blessed Kateri as "protectress and model of Kahnawake and Akwesasne¹." In the beautifully decorated sanctuary, stood a statue of Blessed Kateri in a woodland setting,

On Sunday morning, at 8:30 a.m., Fr. Egan was the Principal Celebrant and Homilist at Mass. I summed up Blessed Kateri's meaning for St. Regis at the end of the Eucharist.

During the forenoon, Fr. Paul Emile Beaudoin, S.J., arrived from Kahnawake, delegated by the Very Rev. Fr. Bernard Carrière, S.J., Provincial, who was attending a three-day reunion of the Canadian Religious Conference, and by Fr. Leon Lajoie, S.J., who was taking care of the religious services at the Mission of St. Francis Xavier. About the same time, undeterred by the icy roads to the south, Fr. ^{Robert J} Roland Boyle, S.J., Director of the Martyrs' Shrine at Auriesville, N.Y., reached St. Regis in time for the 11 a.m. liturgy. With them and Frs. Egan, Fleig, and Lavigne, I offered the Holy Sacrifice.

Music during the Eucharistic Celebration was supplied by the Akwasasne Singers and Dancers led by Sr. Kateri assisted by Guitarist Pat Sunday. The first Reading of the Liturgy of the Word was done by Mrs. Ruth Papineau; the Responsorial Psalm, by Todd Papineau, her grandson; and the second reading by ^{Mr.} Irving Papineau, Todd's father and Ruth's son. For the Gospel Procession, Mr. David Wood bore the Book of the Gospels accompanied by the Misses April Lazore and Tira Benedict. Fr. Egan read the Gospel and gave the homily. During the Prayer of the Faithful, Miss Marjorie King and her son Tracy, Mr. and Mrs. James Caldwell, Mrs. Agnes Lazore and her daughter Maureen, ^{Miss} the Mrs. Dorothy Jacobs and Lillian Herne acted as Bearers of Gifts. Before the final blessing, Sr. Kateri Mitchell, and Sr. Kathleen Navarra offered an audio visual Present-

tation on Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha. The Recessional was sung in Iroquois (words by Miss Elizabeth Francis and Sr. Kateri).

Fr. Clarence M. Devan of St. Joseph's in Bombay, N.Y., and Fr. Roland B. Menard of St. Mary's of the Fort, Fort Covington, N.Y., after offering the Holy Sacrifice in their own parishes, were able to attend most of the Eucharistic Celebration at St. Regis, before joining the parishioners who were all invited to dinner at Kateri Hall in Hogansburg, N.Y.

Three eye-catching cakes accompanied it.

The hall was tastefully decorated. One of the most artistic centerpieces you could wish for graced the head table. Behind, on the wall hang a banner of striking beauty with Kateri modeled on her image at St. Patrick's cathedral in New York City, the work of the Mrs. Marie Mitchell, and Glenda and Lily Benedict. The food, including Indian delicacies, prepared by the Kitchen Toilers² of the Altar and Rosary Society, was fit for the most fastidious gourmets.

The very able Program Coordinator was Fr. Fleig; the M.C., Mr Harry Pyke. For the le Akwasasne Singers and Dancers, Mrs. Agnes Lazore presented me with a hand-carved rosary with Mohawk motifs on the beads; Dr. Solomon Cook, Senior Chief on the American side of the Reserve, offered a ribbon Indian shirt in the name of the parishioners; Chief Billy Sunday, a fine bone collar with a beaded wolf pendant in the name of the Canadian Band Council.

The afternoon continued with square dances. The musicians Mr. John White, electric guitarist, and Mr. Joseph Jacobs, violinist, set the couples into motion. The Caller was none other than Mr. Mose McDonald, President of the Parish Council. Miss Kateri Pyke ended the festivities by tap-dancing her way into the hearts of all.

An now my heartfelt thank you to all of Blessed Kateri Tekakwitha's sisters

and brothers here at St. Regis. As I have been doing for many years, I will keep on including you daily in my intentions at the Eucharistic Celebration and in my prayers to the Lily of the Mohawks.

Members of the Blessed Kateri Music Ministry from the ~~the~~ Ojibway settlements of Northern Ontario traveled to St Regis and Kahnawake in mid-September ^{23-24, 25-26} to lead an evening of song praise for the ~~Mohawk~~ Catholic Mohawk people in each location.

Rev Mr Murray Sayers, the first married deacon among the Ojibways, and his wife Betsy founded the prayer group after they had traveled to Rome along with their two sons to represent their parish in ^{BATCHAWANA} ~~Sault Ste Marie~~ Ont. at the beatification of Kateri Tekakwitha. According to Murray's own testimony very few of his people had heard of the saintly Mohawk maiden prior to the news that the Holy Father, Pope John Paul II, had decided to pronounce her a blessed. On their return from Rome, the Murray couple were prompted to start a prayer group ~~to~~ among their people to make Blessed Kateri better known and to ~~the~~ enlist her ~~the~~ intercession ~~of~~ in a ministry of healing.

Among the twenty-three members of the group who came on the tour were four new candidates for the diaconate among the ~~the~~ Ojibway people: Richard Sayers of Iron Bridge, Lawrence Andrews of Birch Island, Domenic Esh Kabogan of Massey and Dennis Thaura of Val Caron. Their association with the two Mohawk communities came as a result of the marriage of one of their Ojibway brothers, Ron Boyer to a Mohawk girl from Kahnawake, Sheila Boyer.
