The Catherine Tekakwitha religious award is given to Junior Girl Scouts of the Catholic faith. Catherine Tekakwitha was an Indian girl born in Auriesville, New York in 1656, and who later moved to Canada. She was converted to Catholicism by Jesuits. She died in 1680 at the age of 24.
